Biography:

Louis-Philippe Lampron is a full professor at the Université Laval's Faculty of Law where he teaches and primarily conducts research into the areas of human rights and freedoms and constitutional law. His work focuses on fundamental freedoms, the right to equality, freedom of expression, freedom of conscience and religion, along with issues related to secularism and the state's religious neutrality.

A graduate of Université Laval, where he earned a bachelor's, a master's, and a doctorate in law, he also holds a doctorate in law from the University of Avignon and the Vaucluse region in France. A member of the Quebec Bar, he is also a member of the Interdisciplinary Research Centre on Diversity and Democracy (CRIDAQ), where he co-directs the research axis on "Institutions, Social Justice, and Territories."

The author of numerous scholarly works, Louis-Philippe Lampron is particularly interested in the relationship between individual liberties, the principle of equality, and collective choices within democratic societies. His book, *The Hierarchy of Rights: Religious Beliefs and Fundamental Rights in Canada*, earned him the Quebec Bar Foundation's "New Author" award in 2013.

A frequent media commentator, he also contributes to public debate on rights and freedoms, secularism, freedom of expression, and the protection of democratic institutions in Quebec and Canada.
